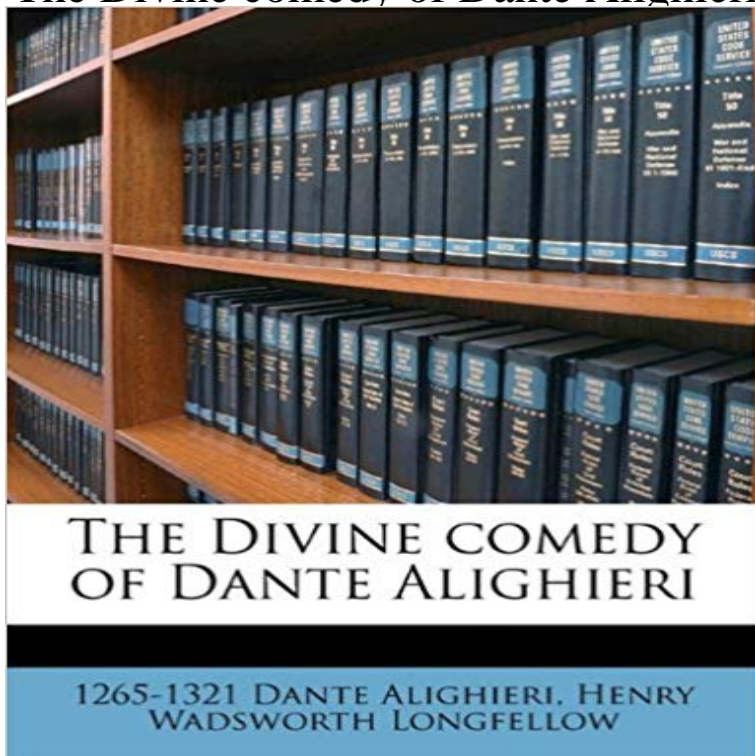


The Divine comedy of Dante Alighieri
