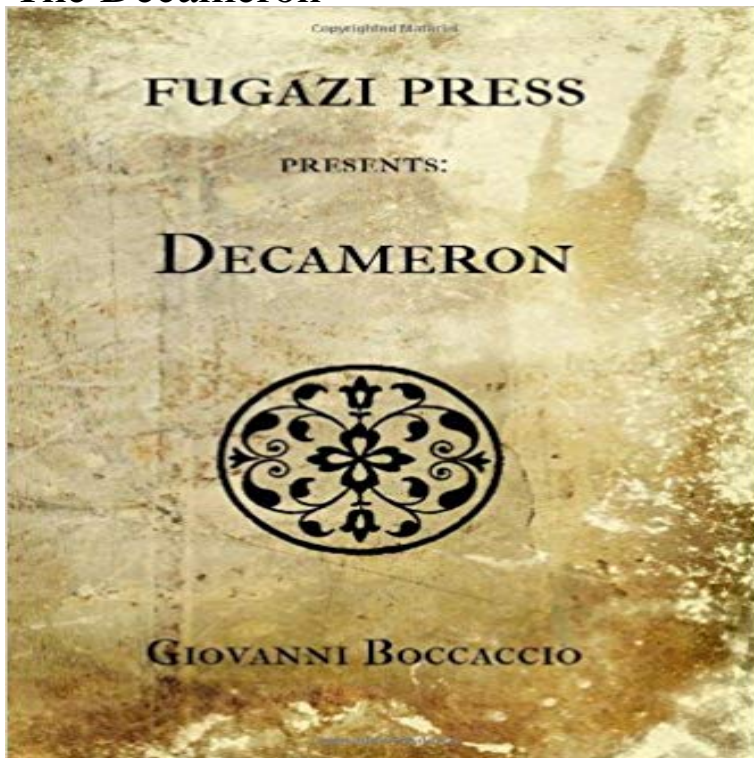


The Decameron
