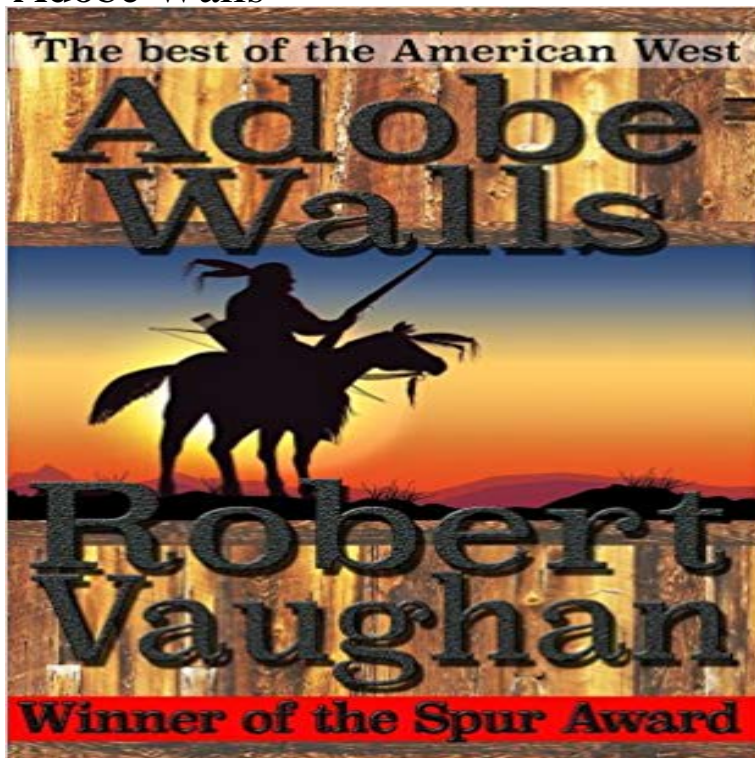


Adobe Walls
