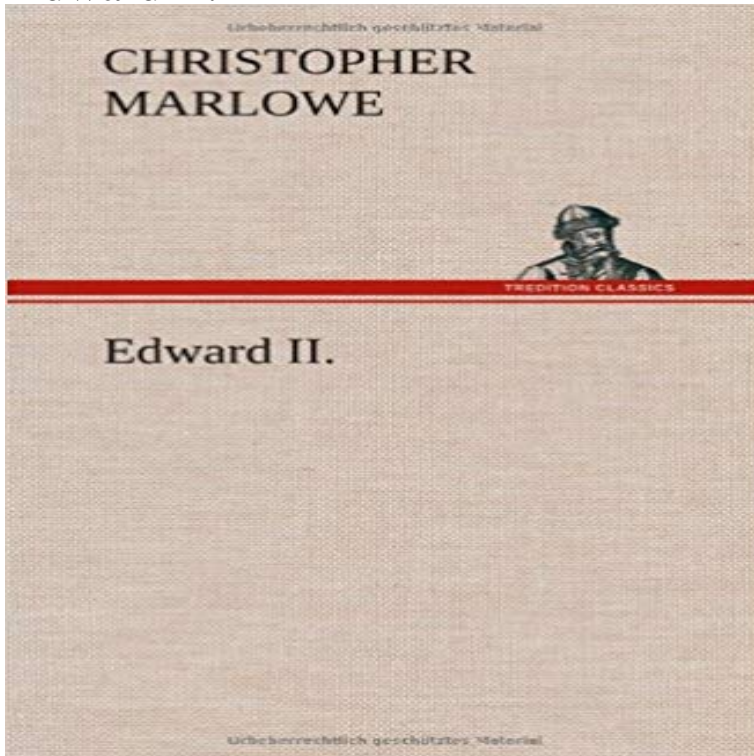


Edward II.
