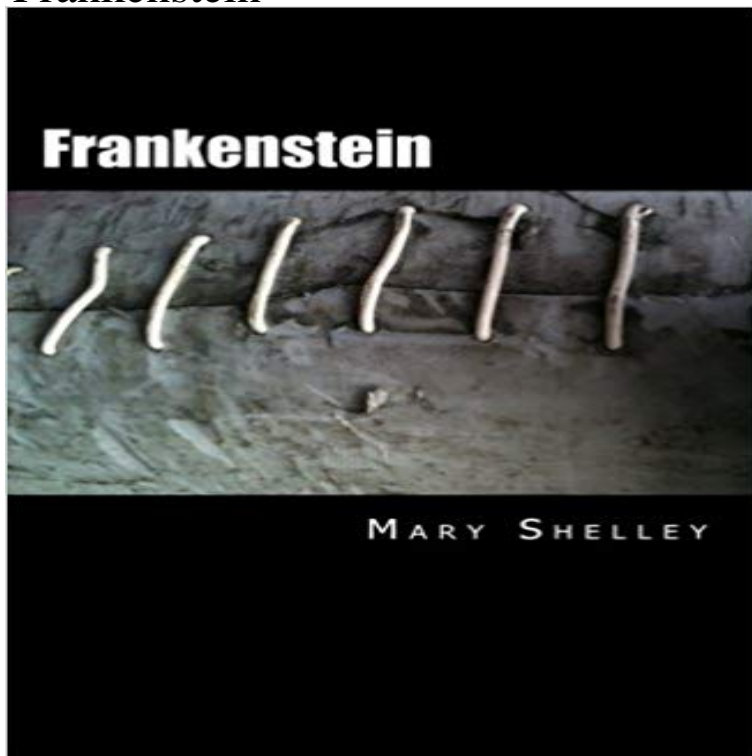


Frankenstein
