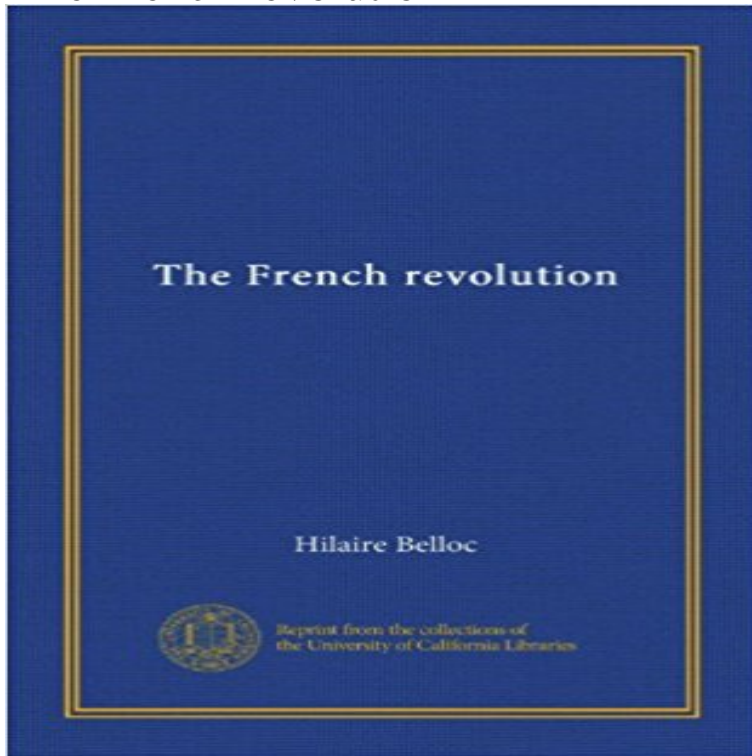


The French revolution
