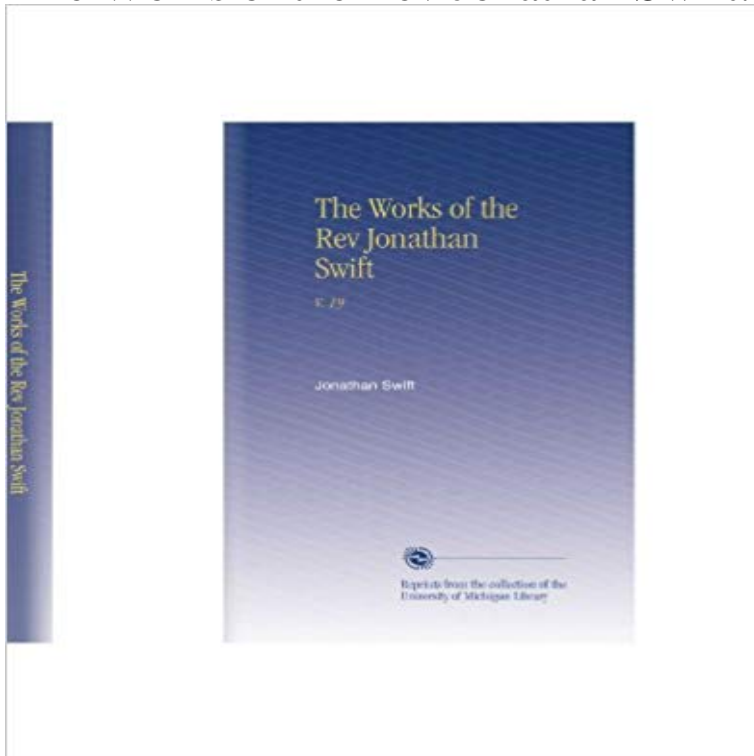


## The Works of the Rev Jonathan Swift: V. 19

I am extremely Mrs. Kellys humble servant; but I will never believe she is more valued for her beauty and good qualities in Ireland than she was in England.
