


Ligeia

Ligeia was one of Edgar Allan Poe's first published short stories, and spurred much debate as to the symbolism of Ligeia's death and supposed resurrection. A pioneer of the short story genre, Poe's stories typically captured themes of the macabre and included elements of the mysterious. His better-known stories include *The Fall of the House of Usher*, *The Pit and the Pendulum*, *The Murders in the Rue Morgue*, *The Masque of the Red Death* and *The Tell-Tale Heart*.
