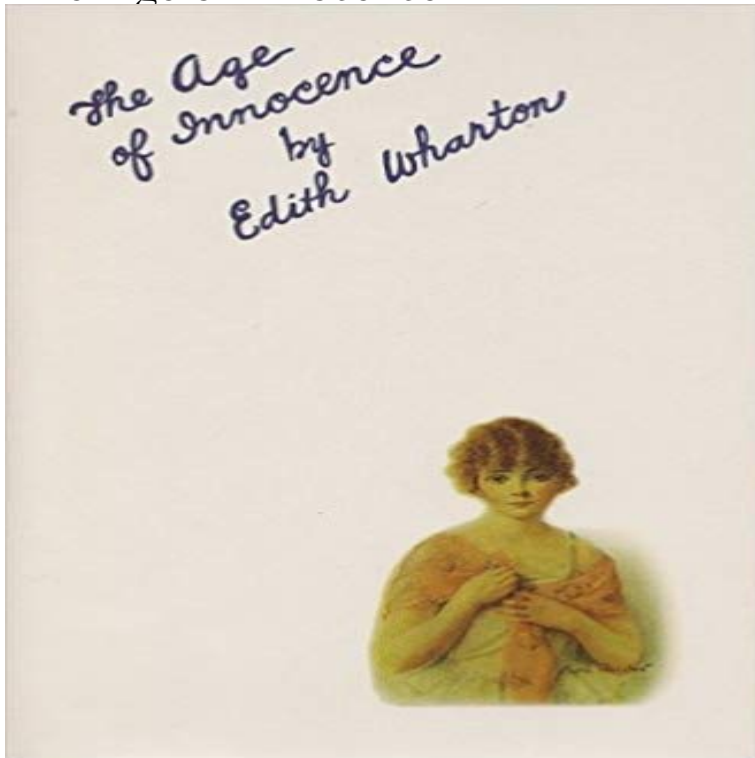


The Age of Innocence
