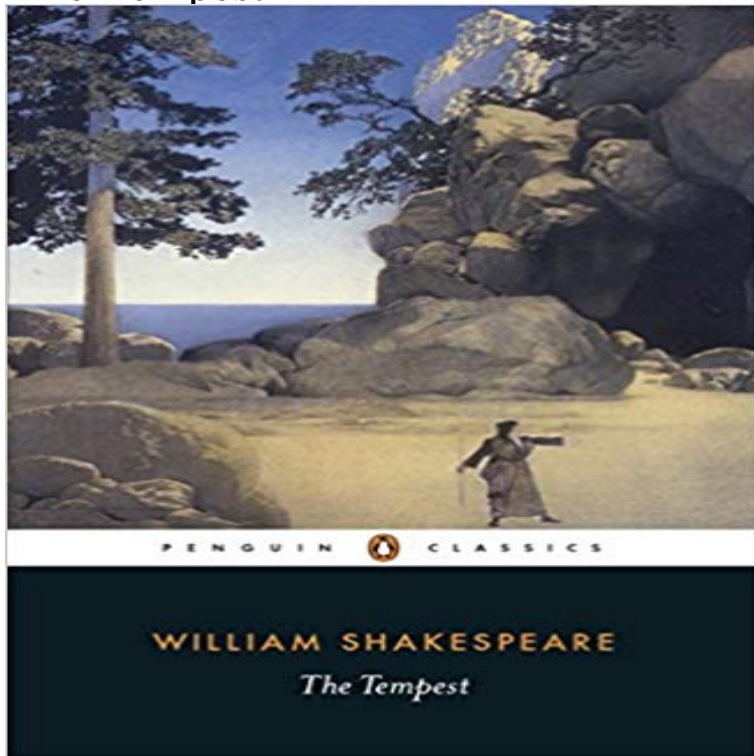


The Tempest



Performed variously as escapist fantasy, celebratory fiction, and political allegory, *The Tempest* is one of the plays in which William Shakespeare's genius as a poetic dramatist found its fullest expression. This Penguin Shakespeare edition is edited with an introduction by Martin Butler. How many goodly creatures are there here! How beauteous mankind is! O brave new world, That has such people int! A storm rages. Prospero, his daughter Miranda, and his monstrous servant Caliban watch from their desert island as a ship carrying the royal family is wrecked. Miraculously, all on board survive. Plotting, mistaken identities, bewitching love and drunkenness follow as the travellers explore the strange place of spirits and monsters on which they have landed. They soon begin to realize all is not as it seems, in a play whose magical setting and classical unity of time and place have inspired films as varied as *Forbidden Planet*, Peter Greenaway's *Prosperos Books*, and Julie Taymors *The Tempest*, starring Helen Mirren as Prospera. This book contains a general introduction to Shakespeare's life and Elizabethan theatre, a separate introduction to *The Tempest*, a chronology, suggestions for further reading, an essay discussing performance options on both stage and screen, and a commentary.
