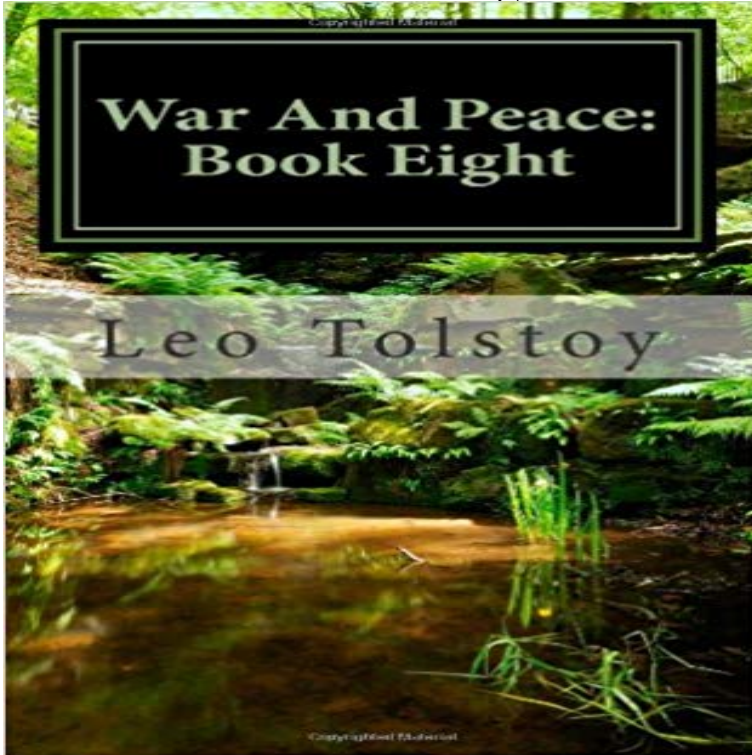


## War And Peace: Book Eight
