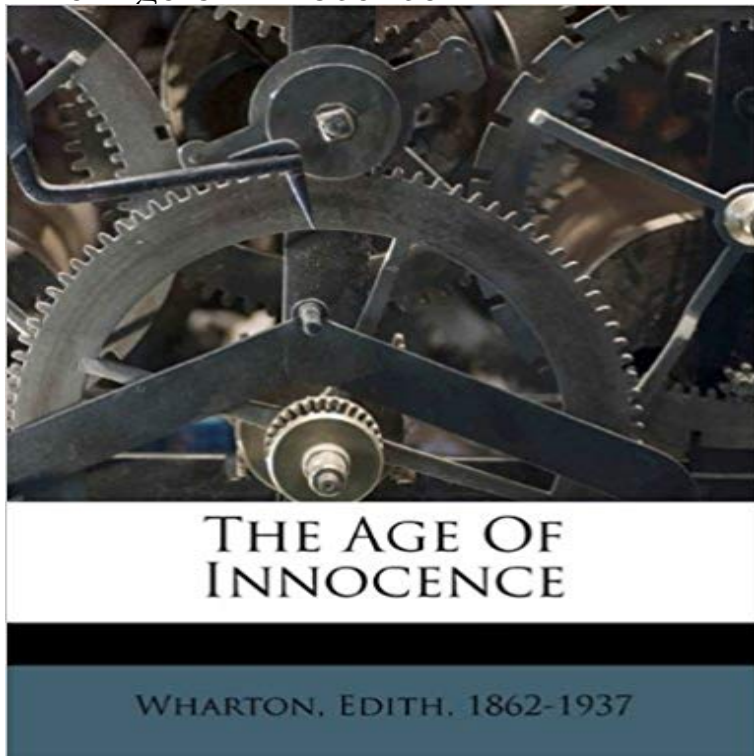


## The Age of Innocence
